

Are your learners mixing up **b** and **d**? Try one of these tricks to end **b d** confusion!

Your mouth can help!






When you say the sound /b/ your lips are closed tight, like a line! The line is the part you write first for the letter b!



When you say the sound /d/ your lips are open, like a circle! The circle is the part you write first for the letter d!






Teach your students that lowercase **b** fits perfectly inside of uppercase **B**.


